Congratulations! You are in the final stretch and close to graduation! This project will be an opportunity for you to reflect on your school experience as well as share your plans for the future.

Directions: You will create one final portfolio that includes **3 of the elements listed below**. You can create a paper-based portfolio or you may create a PowerPoint presentation.

1. Creative Writing- This is a letter to yourself, reflective journal or a poem that captures your favorite moments from your senior year. This should include pivotal moments that show your unique journey this year.
2. Photographic Timeline- You will create a timeline of your life events from birth through senior year only using pictures and dates. Try to include/ highlight 7-10 events.
3. Soundtrack of your life- Create a list of 7-10 songs that would be the soundtrack for your life. List each song and artist. Write a one-paragraph reflection of why these songs capture your life.
4. Activities/ Hobbies/ Family/ Friends- What has occupied your time outside of school? Are you involved in a club sport? Service club? Church? Or other organization? What does being part of this group mean to you? Explain in at least one paragraph.
5. Thank you letter- Write a letter to a parent, guardian or sibling thanking them for contributing to your success.
6. Thank you letter to a teacher- Write a thank you letter to your favorite teacher. This can be any teacher you have had from Kindergarten all the way through 12th grade. Thank them for contributing to your success.
7. College/ Post-School Goals or Plans- What is your plan after graduation?
8. Favorite poem- Include a copy of your favorite poem and write a one-paragraph reflection about why it is your favorite poem. If you do not have a favorite, you may write a poem that describes your schooling experience.
